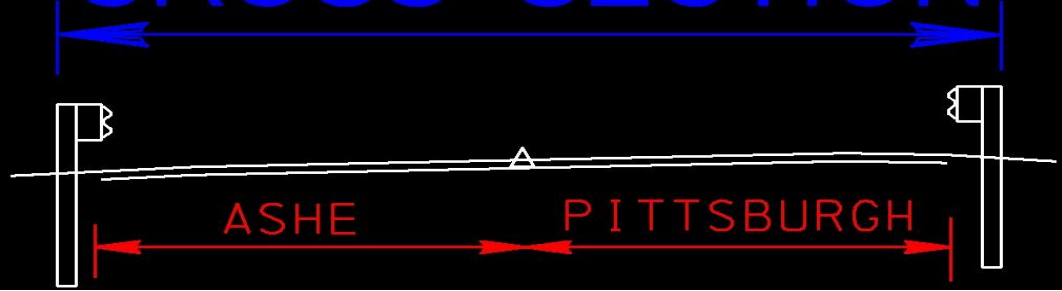

ASHE Pittsburgh's November dinner meeting was held at the Engineers Society of Western Pennsylvania. The topic of the meeting was Route 28 from a Contractor's Perspective and we had five great speakers discussing the recently completed project. Greg Cerminara from Michael Baker International was the moderator for the presentation while Jim Foringer from PennDOT District 11-0 discussed the oversight of the project as the owner. The meeting also included the three project managers from each of the prime contractors who completed this complex and challenging project. Tim Taylor from Brayman Construction Corporation led the discussion about the A50 Section which started just north of the Chestnut Street Overpass and extended to just south of the 40th Street Bridge. John Schwab discussed the A09 and A10 Sections that Trumbull Corporation constructed along the Norfolk Southern Rail line and along SR 0028 mainline at the 40th Street Bridge. Pasquale Paliotta was the project manager for the final section A53 constructed by Carmen Paliotta Contracting, Inc., which included the section of SR 0028 that connected to the existing road and all the artwork and finishing touches from the project.

January Dinner Meeting Recap!



The ASHE Pittsburgh January dinner meeting was held at Bella Sera, Canonsburg Pennsylvania. The topic of the meeting was the SR 0079, Section 20H South Junction Interchange Ramp G-3 Tunnel. We had three great speakers discussing the recently completed project. Chuck Niederriter the Chief Operating Officer of Golden Triangle Construction introduced the project and the idea of revising the design to replace a bridge rehabilitation with a new cast-in-place concrete culvert under the existing bridge. This revision did not result in any additional cost for the project and will save millions on future projects along the corridor due to over widening of the proposed culvert. Dan Piatt a Senior Highway Design Engineer for Mackin Engineering Company was the project manager for the Ramp G-3 Tunnel and described the complexity of the design. Dan highlighted the necessary horizontal and vertical alignment adjustment that need to be made to fit the culvert under the existing bridge. The project was able to utilize the existing pavement from the old loop ramp to minimize the need for temporary pavement during construction. The presentation was finished by Dave Sciullo the Vice President of Construction at Golden Triangle Construction. Dave detailed the final construction of the culvert and provided the group with a lot of great photos of the construction showing how restricted the work area was with respect to the existing bridge.



Pennsylvania Turnpike 75th Anniversary



Imagine a time when getting around wasn't so easy. Imagine driving cross-state on mountainous, meandering two-lane roads. Stopping at intersections. Moving only as fast as the traffic ahead. That changed 75 years ago, when the first vehicles glided past gleaming toll booths, down concrete ramps and onto the Pennsylvania Turnpike. The original, 160-mile long Turnpike opened Oct. 1, 1940 becoming America's First Superhighway.



Nobody had experienced anything like it—an unbroken ribbon of concrete cutting through mountains and across valleys, bypassing towns. No stop signs, no intersections, no speed limits. The PA Turnpike received nationwide acclaim as an engineering marvel during its development in the late 1930s as America's first four-lane, limited-access highway.



When it opened, it paved the way for our nation's Interstate Highway System. The Turnpike established the national standard for superhighway design and construction more than 16 years before the first U.S. Interstate Highway. It was the granddaddy of the interstates, the model upon which other limited-access highways were built.

Today, the PA Turnpike stretches more than 550 miles—triple its original length. It continues its legacy of innovation in the ground-transportation industry with a modern-day mission to operate a safe, reliable, customer-valued toll road system that supports national mobility and commerce. Recent advances include designing and building award-winning facilities and structures, investing in wider and smoother roadways, and providing traveler benefits such as an innovative Smartphone app and a dedicated, 24/7 customer safety and response team.
